The year is 1588. Catholic King Philip II rules Spain and Protestant Elizabeth I sits on the English throne. Philip wants to invade and conquer England and restore Catholicism in that country. He assembles a fleet of 130 ships and 30,000 men---the Spanish Armada. They sail in late May commanded by Alsonso de Guzman, Duke of Medina, an aristocrat without naval experience, appointed by Philip. He is to sail up the English Channel and join with the Duke of Parma in Flanders (part of the Spanish Netherlands). He is to escort an invasion force that will land in England and overthrow Elizabeth. But

he is defeated by the British Navy. Among the factors contributing to the defeat and withdrawal of the Armada were bad weather conditions and the better employment of naval guns and battle tactics by the English.

Channel 1971 offers 2 exciting Documentaries that detail and explain England's heroic victory at sea and left that country the naval power of the world for hundreds of years.



The Untold Story Of The Spanish Armada: The Truth Behind England's Heroic Victory 44 Minutes

The story of the Spanish Armada is almost legendary - Oueen Elizabeth I versus her former brother-in-law and one-time suitor, Phillip II. Sir Francis Drake singeing Spanish beards and playing bowls - fire ships in Calais harbor - Spanish galleons shipwrecked off the coast of Ireland. It has always been told as a story of English heroism and skill, beating off the greatest armada ever assembled, helped a little by the weather. Now marine archaeology and new documentary evidence are telling a new tale - not so much of English flair and skill, more a case of Spanish illpreparedness for a naval battle and incompetence. It may have been an armada, but the evidence suggests the Spanish simply never intended to fight at sea.

Hoover Dam: America's Impossible Engineering Masterpiece 55 Minutes

Hoover Dam, on the Colorado River between Arizona and Nevada, is one of the biggest dams ever: 200 meters at its base, 220 meters tall and 380 meters large. It is taller than the Giza pyramid. An unprecedented 3 billion cubic meters of concrete forms a 180 km long reservoir, the largest in the US.

When Whales Could Walk 55 Minutes Giant fossils uncovered in the Sahara Deser

Giant fossils uncovered in the Sahara Desert reveal new secrets of how whales evolved. In Egypt's Sahara Desert, massive skeletons with strange skulls and gigantic teeth jut out from the sandy ground. This fossil grave-yard, millions of years old, is known as the "Valley of the Whales." Now, paleontologists have unearthed a whole new species of ancient whale dating to 43 million years ago, and this predator wasn't just able to swim – it also had four legs and could walk. Follow scientists as they search for new clues to the winding evolutionary path of mammals that moved from the land into the sea to become the largest animals on Earth.

Erich Korngold

Austrian composer and conductor

Erich Wolfgang Korngold (1897 – 1957) was an Austrian composer and conductor who fled Europe in the mid-1930s and later adopted US nationality. A child prodigy, he became one of the most important and influential composers in Hollywood history. He was a noted pianist and composer of classical music, along with music for Hollywood films, and the first composer of international stature to write Hollywood scores. His score for **Anthony Adverse** (1936) won an Oscar; two years later he won another Oscar for **The Adventures of Robin Hood** (1938). Korngold scored 16 Hollywood films in all, and received two more nominations for Oscars.




